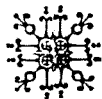

tarch *reporteth in the life of CATO* the yonger. This inuention was increased afterward by SENECA: that the number of characters grue to 7000. Whether through iniurie of time, or that men gaue it over for tediousnes of learning, nothing remaineth extant of CICEROES inuention at this day. Upon consideration of the great vse of such a kinde of writing, I haue inuented the like: of fewe characters, short and easy, euery character answering

ring a word: my inuention meere English, without precept, or imitation of any. The vses are diuers: short, that a swift hande may therewith write orations or publike actions of speach, uttered as becometh the grauitie of such actions, verbatim. Secrete, as no kinde of wryting like, and herein (besides other properties) excelling the wryting by letters, and alphabet, in that, nations of strange languages, may hereby communi-

cate their meaning together in writing, though of sundrie tongues, it is reported of the people of China, that they have no other kinde, and so traflike together many Provinces of that kingdom, ignorant one of an others speech. Their characters are very long, and harde to make, that a dosen of mine, may be written as soone as one of theirs; Besides, they wanting an alphabet, fall into an infinite number, which is a thing that

that greatlie chargeth memory, and may discourage the learner.

This my inuention I am emboldened to dedicate vnto your maiesty, in that among other your princelie vertues, your maiesty is woont to approue of euerie good and profitable inuention of learning: and in duetic of thankfulnessse am I much more bounde thereunto, from whome I haue receiued asurance of the fruite of my studies, by your maiesties

An Instruction to the
Reader, how the art is
to be learned. :



Hou hast here gentle reader, an art of short, and so of speedie wryting, plainly delivered vnto thee. So as by thine own industry, thou maiest attain unto it, if thou wilt but one month take paines therein, and by continuance of an other month, maiest thou attain to great readines. For thy better instructiō, thou art first to learne the characterie words by heart, and therewith the making of the figure to the character, to doo it readily, and cleane, then, to be able to joyne euery character to the word

word pronounced, without book or sight of any pattern before thee. This done, thou art farther to proceed, and to learn how to refer eyther words of like signification, or of the same kinde, or contraries into those that be quite characterie. Here because e-uery man. by his own reach can not consider how to refer all words, thou hast in this book an English dictionary, with words of referēce already thereto adioyned to help such as of thēselues can not so dispose thē. The words which are called appeliatiue, if they signifie things that haue distinct parts: those parts are to be written on the one side, and the things and all the sortes of that

that kind, on the other, and where there be many of a kind for cleerer distinction, part thē into diuers sides. Likewise, as thou maiest see in the table of thē more particularly. Instead of much laborious writing; for thy speedie exercise, and ease, thou maiest cause one to read the dictionarie to thee, while thou writest it, and so in that small quantity of paper hast thou to exercise thee more, thē if thou shouldst write whole volumes. And if thou wilt take pains to cast the characterie words into some discourse, as liketh thee best, so hast thou a means of reteyning the art, and keeping it without al danger of forgetting.

Moreover, thou maiest exercise this art after a while learning, as well by reading without writing as if thou diddest write, by calling the character to thy minde, and the worde of reference. So hast thou the art of short, swifte, and secrete writing, none comparable.

THE ARTE OF

Characterie.



Characterie is an art of writing brieflie.

It hath two parts.

The first parte is concerning the making of the characters.

The second is concerning the value, and signification of them.

The character is a brief mark of a word.

To characters doe belong two thinges: figure, and Ioyning.

The figure ought to be easie, and brief.

The Ioyning of characters consisteth of situation, and distinction

The situation of character ought to be one directly under the other.

The distinction ought to be made with a prick sette under the character, at every breathing, or pause of the sentence as)

These are properties belonging to all characters. The kinds of characters are two: simple or compound.

The simple one is a character made of no other, and is varied by every kinde of position, hanging or lying.

It is either a straight line, or crooked.

A straight line hanging direct, as, | or bias as / \ lying, thus, —

A crooked line, is either half circle or whole, hanging thus, \cup \subset lying thus \cup \cup The whole circle thus \circ

The compounded characters are such as be made of the simple.

The compound character hath two parts: the one is the body of the character, and the other is an addition to it.

The body of the character is a single straight character, & by it is varied the position of the character compounded thereof.

The addition is to either side of the body, to the head or to the foot.

The addition is either single, or compound.

Single, when the addition

is

is of one line only: and that eyther streight, or croked.

Streight line to the head of either side, thus: r r r r to the foote, thus: j l j l

A crooked line to the head, thus; r r r r to the foot, thus: j l j l

A compound addition is when the addition consisteth of two lines.

The compound addition is of two sorts: either of the same kind of lines, as two crooked as r , or one streight and the other crooked, at the head thus r r , at the foot thus j l .

The second part of Characterie, touching the signification of the Character

THe signification of the character is of two sorts, solitary or accompanied.

The solitary signification is that, which a solitary character exprefseth.

That is, certain words whereto all other may bee referred, called charactericall.

The charactericall words, are a number that have neither agreement, nor contrariety together: but stand indifferently affected.

These are all contained in the table following, with the
Cha

Characterie

character adioyned to each word.

Let a short crook, serve an usual and short word: and a long one a long word: except the order in the alphabet disposed for memory, cause alteration.

A word of the same sound, though of diuerse sense, is written with the same: as, fast, for abstinence from meat, for swiftness, and sureness: so if it much differ not, as whore, and hore, whole, and hole.

Of the properties belonging to words.

THE properties belonging to words, are shewed by plain expressing them: or are gathered by nature of the speech. They

They are expressed by pricks on to the side of the character.

They are common to all words, or peculiar unto certain.

The common is, to be primitiue, or deriuatue.

Of primitiues, or deriuatues.

Primitiues and deriuatues are known by the language: as, he is a virtuous man, not a virtue man: fear God, honor the king: not fearful, so not honourable.

Deriuatue words that end in er, require two prickes at the right side of the character: as, labourer is deriued of labour. †

Such as end in ship, as friend

friendship, or hood, as neighbourhood, require in the word written, the character of ship to be placed underneath: and whether it, or hood be to be read, the language will plainly deliver. For no man will read either neighbourhood, or friendship.

Such be written with the character of h, and a prick on the left side, as: †

Thus much of primitiues and deriuatues: which are common to all words.

Now of peculiar properties.

THE peculiar to nownes are number and comparison

A; going before the word, declareth the singular number: as, a man, not, a men.

Whē the, goeth before, place a prick at the side of the character following, to note its plural number, as *ḡ* the ages.

The character of this requirēth a prick on the side, to signify thus. *ḡ*

The rest is declared by the language: as, two men, not two man.

Of comparison.

The comparative degree is known from the other, by than, following: as, Gold is better than silver, not good than silver, nor best.

The superlative degree is declared by of, following: as, Gold is best of mettalls.

When comparison is betwixt two, of, significth the comparative degree: as, better of twain.

Hetherto of properties belonging to nouns: it followeth of such as belong to verbs, as tence, or time.

Of Tence.

If the time be parted frō the word, as, I will against such a day, do this: then make the mark of the time at the side of the person: as, *.l.ḡ*

The time of doing anything if it be past, and is signified by haue: let the character for haue, be written.

If had, doe signify it, make a prick in the character of haue, on the left hand. *ḡ*

If did, make the like prick in the character of do, on the same side. *ḡ*

The time to come requireth a prick on the right side.

When would is to be expressed, write the character of well for it, and read it would: and for should, make a prick on the right side of well.

The present tence wanteth a prick, and so is known from other tences.

A word of doing, that endeth in ing, as, eating, drinking, &c, requireth two pricks direct under the body of the character, as $\sqrt{76}$

Other times or tences, depicted upon these, and are plainly discerned by the nature of the language. A

A note of Numbers, & proper names.

NUMBERS are written by the heads of the compound characters, with a streight bodie hanging, and take increase by place, as cyphers in arithmetike.

Proper names, if they be significant, are written by character: as field, day, &c. otherwise the head of the character bearing the figure of a letter added also to the foot, and so joyned in one figure, may serve for two letters: as $ab\perp ac\perp ad\perp ae\perp ba\perp be\perp$ &c and so other two, till all the word, or as much as necessary, shall be written: with a mark at the side of the first character, to show that it is a name.

*Hetherto concerning the
solitary signification, with properties
belonging to words It fol

The accompanied signification is that which the character expressed by an addition to it.

This addition, is the heads of streight characters, each answering a letter in the alphabet.

These additions carry the first letter of the accompanied signification, to declare what it is.

If the accompanied signification have two words of like beginning as ledde, and latine, take two of the first letters made into one character, as before any names, for differēce.

If two, be like, (which is very rare) leaue the vowel, or the consonant, of the one, for difference, as in stretch and strain, and take that which may make the difference.

The accompanied signification is of two kindes.

Either when the very word is signified or the sense only.

The very word, when the precise word is to be signified.

Here sometimes falleth out a shortening of writing.

First, when and, or, any, or such cōiunctions come betwixt two words that are of like signification, or contraries: then: instead of the character of the second, place the addition inserting the first letter of that word, to the side of the coniunction as $\frac{h}{l}$ life and death.

And if many synominaes, or contraries be uttered not coupled by any coniunction, make a pricke instead of the cōniunction, and note those synominaes, or contraries, with their marks, as before is said, as part whole; lumpe, peece, thus: ¶ The second shortening is in repetitions.

If the repetition be of single wordes, the figure of the number how oft it is repeated is to be added to the left side of the character of the repeated word, or so many pricks, as earth, earth, earth, hear the word of the Lord. ¶

If it be of a sentēce, or whole part thereof, place a circle on the right side of the first repeated woordes character.

Thus: In perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils of the sea, write thus, ¶

The accompanied signification in expresse word, is of two sorts. Either of like, and consenting significatiō with the solitary: or of dissenting.

The consenting significatiō requireth the mark on the left side.

The consenting significatiō is of two kinds.

When the accompanied signification is a syonima to the solitary, or a kind of it.

Synonima, as anger, rage, fury, → ♯ → 7 →

Thus much of the consenting signification: the followeth of the dissenting.

The dissenting signification is when the accompanied dissenteth from the solitary.

Here the addition is to be placed on the right side, as:

When it is a mere denying it hath only a dash through the character, whose word it denieth, as, is, is not: good, not good. — † ‡ †

Here place the shortening on the right side, as life, and death, neither good nor badde. ¶

When such a contrarie is first to be written, as is not conteyned in the title of characterly wordes, then write it with the addition, and let the conjunction

iunction be accompanied with the mark on the left side, as death and life. ¶¹

Which mark is a pricke if it be the solitary signification that is to be written, otherwise a mark of the synonima, thereof *Hetherto cōserving the accompanied signification of the expresse words it followeth of the sense.*

The sense only is to be taken with the character, whē besides that we desire to be swift, the very expresse worde is not necessary. That is, when they do but fill the speech, or otherwise are not of the substance matter: as, circumlocutions, and purposes.

Of the first sort is, when we leue out the special, and peculiar properties: as, high heauen, eternal God. Here leaue out

out high, and eternal.

So when a phrase is to be taken with a worde: as, he tooke himself to his heels, for he fled.

Also here may be left out the word of like signification, as, praise for cōmend, greene, for molest, etc.

The other sort is, when the thing described, or diuided, is put for the description, or diuision: as, for creator of heauen and earth, God: the redeemer of mankinde, Christ.

So, for master, seruant, children, father, mother, olde and young: the whole familie.

At the side of the character of the thing described, place w at the diuided x
